




Deposits per Functional Group (%)

^{1.} The amounts shown in the above tables and graphical arrangements represents the actual flow of funds through the RDP Fund as administered by the Accountant General in National Treasury. These funds howeveronly represent a portion of the total ODA received in South Africa. Other amounts which by passes the RDP Fund include aid that is disbursed directly to NGO's and CSOs as well as In Kind donations which arechallenging to report on as it is not channelled through official government systems.

^{2.} ODA funding is not appropriated to the various departments as is the case with voted funding. Voted funding is allocated to Departments by means of the appropriation bill as approved by Parliament. All ODA funding is governed by a government to government agreement that is signed by the National Executive and which is then forwarded to Parliament for tabling only. This funding is channelled through the RDP fund and as such is subject to the RDP Fund Act and amendment Act which states that all funds not spent at the end of a financial year must be surrended back to the Fund. Where an agreement makes provision for the funds to be rolled over at the end of a financial year the funds do not have to be surrendered back to the Fund.
